When Less is More

We are indeed fortunate to live in a beautiful neighborhood with historic homes situated on large lots with front and backyards. Ingleside Terraces is the result of careful planning by Joseph A. Leonard and his Urban Realty Company in the early 20th Century. Influenced by the City Beautiful Movement, Leonard designed and built single-family homes in Ingleside Terraces in a variety of architectural styles including Craftsman, English, French and Spanish Revival.

These well-designed homes continue to hold their value in a terraced, park-like urban setting. Most residences retain exterior details that identify their Revival or Craftsman styles (look for: massing, scale, exterior fabric, roof lines, balconies, wrought iron railings, arched or divided-light wooden windows). Inside you find details reflective of the Arts and Crafts Movement (look for: wood wainscoting, picture rails, art tile fireplace surrounds, built-in buffets and bookcases, rooms separated by French doors).

When buyers find a well-maintained house with original details, the purchase price soars. How unfortunate then that some recently purchased homes in the Terraces are gutted to the studs in order to make everything modern and new. These remodels often abandon the historic style of the house and in a few years will look dated. The neighborhood's architectural character suffers. Of course, many older homes need upgrades in plumbing and electrical wiring but modernization can occur without sacrificing architectural character. When a homeowner seeks permits for exterior building renovation, City Planning considers the impact of the proposed project on the architectural character of the home and the surrounding neighborhood. Although changes to the interior are generally not part of Planning's review process, we hope homeowners will carefully consider all the changes they make to their historic home, inside and out.

The Design Review Committee works with residents of Ingleside Terraces to retain the architectural character of our historic neighborhood. Join us to discuss proposed projects and review plans. Contact us at designreview@ithasf.org.

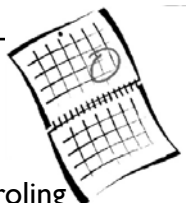

Fourth Quarter Market Trends

The Fall Real Estate Market is upon us, holding steady and doing well. Inventory is always an issue, driving prices in a seller's market like this. Some buyers are choosing condo purchases as an alternative to single-family homes due to the higher prices we are seeing.

There have been 11 homes sold to date in Ingleside Terraces since May of this year, with an average of 121% over-asking prices. The average price per square foot is \$682. Price per square foot is only one way to assess value, and it doesn't take into consideration the quality or condition of each unique property. We have found that careful planning and well-spent dollars for preparing a house for sale have been resulting in great over-asking sale prices. For most people, real estate is their largest asset, so it's worth making the effort to do small improvements to show the property in its best light. If you're looking for some suggestions, I'm in the neighborhood and happy to drop in for a visit. After all, looking at houses is the fun part of my job!
