Welcome to our holiday newsletter. A great group kicked off the season with our Oktoberfest-themed Annual Picnic at Sundial Park. Besides, great food, inspired music and perfect weather, the hit was the watering hole that had neighbors partying around it until it was the only attraction left standing. A special thanks to all of the volunteers capably led by Wendy Dwyer and to Sandy Gandolfo and Anna Barbagelata for sponsoring and volunteering!

This event also unveiled our refurbished Sundial Park and the great paint job coordinated by John Stacey with an initial grant from the Wertheimer family. Long-time residents reported it has never looked better. This project extended to include the trellises at many of the entrances which were in very poor condition. Even with the generous donations, we had to add \$6000 to complete the job. Fortunately, we had the additional funds to handle it.

This brings me to a request of most of you who, while are members by virtue of being residents, have not paid dues yet or in the past. As of this newsletter less than 140 of the 750 homes have used the included envelope to financially support the work we do. It is very fortunate that many of these pay more than the suggested minimum as we have almost \$16,000 in expenses in a normal year. We have been seeing a negative trend in these numbers over the last few years and would like you to consider sending in your dues in whatever amount you can afford before the end of the year so we can continue to keep up the landscaping, put on great events and maintain our special residential park.

We just completed our annual meeting and it was quite informative. We had a comprehensive district update from Supervisor Yee who encouraged us to submit pedestrian safety projects as a Participatory Budget proposal. This process has just started for 2019 and if you have ideas and also want to volunteer some time in putting together the application please let me know via email. We also heard from Neil Ballard of the Ocean Avenue Association about the current beautification projects to spruce up Ocean Avenue. He also let us know about their monthly events at Unity Plaza promoting artists that you should check out.

However, in my opinion, the most interesting report was presented by Officers Hoff and Pineda from the Taraval station. Those of you who are observant neighborhood walkers may have noticed that we have a new "street" called

Ingleside Way that runs between Urbano Dr. and Ocean Ave. just east of Victoria. It is actually a walkway but is now officially owned by the City and maintained by DPW thanks to the initiative of Officer Pineda. This walkway is in regular use and has been the location of a number of safety issues which now can be handled by SFPD since its designation. We applaud his initiative and follow through which was not easy traversing the Planning Department's application and approval process.

I also want to introduce our new board member, Tim Macholz. He and his wife, Erin, moved into their home late last year on Head St. We both welcome them to the neighborhood and look forward to working with Tim starting in January. If you are aware of any new neighbors, please drop a note to Jade at membership@ithasf.org so she can make sure they receive our Welcome Wagon package.

On a more somber note, the last several months of fires in California bring to the forefront the importance of being prepared for emergencies. Out Neighborhood Emergency Response Team (NERT) is a vital resource.
